I have been a member of the ASSE Colorado Chapter since 2015 after moving to Colorado. In 2005, I graduated from Nizhny Novgorod State Agricultural Academy (Russia) as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine. After graduation while working as a Veterinary Consultant, I decided to pursue studies in the United States. Having received a degree from Dickinson State University in 2008, I held several health and safety positions and currently work as an Industrial Hygiene Professional at Whiting Oil & Gas.

Since relocating to Denver, I've taken an active role in the ASSE Colorado Chapter. Most recently, I've been actively involved in organizing the Tank Gauging Round Table discussion (2017) and Silica

Seminar (2018). The goal of these events is to provide a unique forum for industry professionals to come together and discuss health risks posed by the exposure to a specific hazard and raise awareness of the existing solutions in the industry that are used to minimize these risks.

My professional interests lie in the areas of predictive analytics and wearable technologies that are used to prevent health and safety incidents. I am taking an active role in a collective Oil and Gas industry and NIOSH research to evaluate limitations of personal 4-gas monitors and develop a methodology for screening the potential exposure to toxic components of Hydrocarbon Gas and Vapor mixtures. I strongly believe



in developing the profession through mentoring Health & Safety practitioners throughout the professional certification journey. With support of ASSE, I help Health and Safety Professionals achieve the ASP and CSP designations.
